One of the many outreach ideas our Evangelism Team is currently working on is that of a mid-week, lunchtime Word and Prayer gathering, led by me, for those who work downtown. Participants will be encouraged to bring a sack lunch. Tea and water will be provided. The real key to its success, however, will be in getting the word out to as many downtown businesses, office complexes, and apartment locations as possible. Obviously, this gathering should be filled with St. John's members, as well. This is the other key component to its success. And, if it goes well, we could also add some Bible study for those who have the time to stay a bit longer.

Those of you who have participated in the various meetings of our Council, Executive Team, Finance Committee, and other such groups are already familiar with the Word and Prayer format that I have created for our use here at St. John's. But the one thing that will make this slightly-expanded version of Word and Prayer different from those other venues will be the inclusion of 14 minutes of "Centering Prayer". (I had offered both a morning and evening version of this type of gathering in my previous congregation with over two dozen people participating.)

"Centering Prayer" is a type of contemplative prayer, an intentional and prayerful silence. You see, back in the 16thcentury, St John of the Cross wrote: "God's first language is silence." Both silence and stillness, however, are difficult for us these days. We live in a time and place full of noise and movement and full accessibility. We find ourselves continually on-line, plugged-in, and constantly-connected. And when any or all those things are turned off or "down", we usually fidget or even become immobilized.

Yet, since both Scripture and Church tradition tell us that God's voice and presence are often found in stillness and silence, wouldn't it be to our benefit to re-learn these things? Truly, for our own well-being (physically, emotionally, and spiritually), wouldn't we want to re-introduce this practice into our modern daily living?

But it's important to understand that both the Biblical and traditional understanding of silence is not about simply sitting out on the porch with a cup of coffee and enjoying the quiet. Nor is it merely a leisurely walk through the woods, delighting in God's creation, as pleasant as such things may be.

Rather, it is an intentional silence, a focused silence. The Greek word is "hesychia", which can be translated as "sacred stillness". It is the practice of entering into the very presence of God. Or, more correctly, it is the prayerful consenting to the presence and action of God's Holy Spirit already within and around us.

Tracing its roots to the practice and teachings of the Desert Fathers and Mothers (as early as the 3rdcentury), the use of contemplative prayer, particularly, that of Centering Prayer, the Jesus Prayer, and Lectio Divina (which I will write more about on other occasions) are faithful exercises in entering into such sacred space. They are life-giving, soul-breathing means of cultivating the gifts of grace, peace, balance, and wholeness in one's life in God and a life shared with others.

There is so much more depth and blessing to the regular practice of contemplative prayer than what I can offer in this very limited space. I encourage you to look for the cream-colored brochures which I have written and placed in our first floor hallway which contain just a little bit more information and instruction.

We are hoping to launch this new ministry venture in the fall. For now... let me invite your interest, energy, and support in helping to make it the real blessing it can be for folks both within our church and among our community.



From the Stewardship Team

The first two stewardship articles in Tidings highlighted two biblical truths from Charles R. Lane's book *Ask, Thank, Tell*. This article will look at the word *steward*. This word most likely comes from the two old English words that named the person who cared for the pigs of another. This person was called the sty-warden. The original use of this word tells us two things. First, the sty-warden didn't own the pigs. Second, the sty-warden cared for the pigs.

As we read in Genesis 1:27-28, we learn that God created humankind in his image and that he gave us dominion over every living thing that moves upon the earth. And from Psalm 8 we know that God made humans a little lower than God and gave them dominion over the works of his hands and have put all things under their feet.

Humanity has the highest place in the created order but we are still part of the created order. We are accountable to God for how we exercise our dominion. God made us stewards to care for his creation. A steward cares for the possessions of the owner, both for the benefit of the owner and for the benefit of other people who depend on the owner for their well-being. This is the point of the parable of the three slaves who were given talents to manage while the master was gone (Matthew 25:14-25). The expectation was that the slaves would so manage the money that it would grow.

As stewards, we should understand that everything, all 100 percent, belongs to God, and our faith influences how we make use of all that God has entrusted to us. The question we ask should not be "How much of my money should I give to God?" It should be "How much of God's money do I dare keep for myself?"

Rather than taking credit for my possessions, these possessions should cause me to ponder why God has chosen to so bless me. And then focus my life on using the wealth that God has entrusted to me to help those who have less.

We should celebrate the fact that God has named us stewards. To be a steward is to be in a place of high esteem and responsibility. To be God's steward is a privilege like few others.
