Serendipity. That's one of those great words we need to lift up more often. Common definitions often speak of it in terms of fortunate accidents or the unplanned discovery of valuable things. Whenever I stumble across a serendipitous occasion, however, I tend to credit the Holy Spirit at work. Perhaps you do, too.

A bit of serendipity happened around here recently. At least, that's my interpretation of it. A conversation arose at the close of a committee meeting which gave voice to a handful of items totally unrelated to that committee's work, yet identical to the same ideas that have been stirring within my own heart and mind for some time now. God's Spirit spoke through the mouths of a few others, naming the very items that have been on my own "wishlist" for St. John's.

Allow me this opportunity to share that "wishlist" with the rest of you and, making deliberate room for the Spirit to further speak and act through us, I invite you, too, to participate in the conversation. Here, then, are just some of the things I am hoping for St. John's that we might be able to work toward together...

- Two Sunday morning Worship Gatherings with a Learning Hour in-between. I am envisioning a smaller, simplified 8:00am Chapel Liturgy designed to neither exceed 40 minutes in length nor add any extra burden to our choir, usher team, etc. This will be followed by a 9:00am Sunday School and a Pastor-led Adult Class. 10:00am would be the new starting time for our larger Worship in the Sanctuary. And, of course, our gathering for refreshment and fellowship in Memorial Hall would still be enjoyed afterwards.
- Monthly Forums during our Sunday morning refreshment time, allowing for a Q & A dialogue with alternating councilpersons and committee leaders.
- A "Shepherd Program" enlisting the assistance of a team of caring people to make telephone calls to anyone absent from worship for 3-4 Sundays in a row.
- A "Care Board", that is, a continually-updated marker board somewhere near the 3rd Floor Offices listing
 names and locations of St. John's members currently hospitalized, in a care facility, or on our prayer list.
- A small onsite Pantry which can provide persons who come to us for assistance with a simple bag containing a few non-perishable food items, a bottle of water, a couple of travel-size hygiene products, and a card printed with addresses, contact information, and brief explanations of services offered by CAM and Haven for Hope. These two agencies, funded by our congregation, are able to provide assistance in ways so much greater than what we could possibly do on our own. Still, as it was our firm belief and practice in my former parish, I feel that "no one leaves empty-handed" should be our motto here, as well.

Again, I invite your conversation about any or all of these ideas. God-willing, our words can become new realities.

Temple Talk by Fred Pfeiffer

September 8, 2019

Last week Pastor Jim talked about serving ourselves and serving outside to those in need. I submit that as Christians, it is our calling and our duty to serve the less fortunate. About forty years ago, St. John's, along with other downtown churches, formed Christian Assistance Ministry (CAM) to provide emergency food, clothing, utility bill help and counseling. About the same time, St. John's and Grace Lutheran joined to establish Christian Senior Services (CSS) to provide Meals on Wheels, prepared from St. John's Kitchen, and Grace Place to provide Alzheimer's day care at Grace Lutheran.

Some thirty years ago, with the purchase of a former Wyatt's Cafeteria near Babcock and 410, Meals on Wheels moved from St. John's, greatly increasing the ability in a building and warehouse provided by Grace Lutheran.

But, being efficient has resulted in some complacency. Over the years, St. John's has supported both CAM and CSS. As individual Christians, we can help feed, clothe and minister to those in need by giving either time and/or treasure. Cash donations are always beneficial, but CSS needs volunteers to deliver meals and CAM needs volunteers to prepare sack lunches, distribute food and clothing and administer counseling. And of course, there is governance. We can provide other services, perhaps on the board. There are also other organizations which we as Christians can support – Haven for Hope, the Food Bank and Habitat for Humanity, just to name three.

In the past, I have served both CAM and CSS as a board member and worked in the CAM warehouse. But today, I think I get more satisfaction and feel more connected when I purchase cans of Spam, rice, beans or peanut butter at the grocery store and bring them to St. John's for CAM. Others bring clothes, towels, sheets and blankets which are delivered to CAM weekly. When you purchase and donate a can of beans, you know it will go into a hungry stomach and this can bring a smile to your face.

In closing, remember what Christ said, "Truly I tell you, just as you did it for one of the least of theses who are members of my family, you did it for me."


Join us and 15 other Lutheran congregations in the San Antonio area as we come together this fall to build an affordable home for the Anderson family.
