God of all mercy and consolation, come to the help of your people, turning us from our sin to live for you alone. Give us the power of your Holy Spirit that we may confess our sin, receive your forgiveness, and grow into the fullness of Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. **Amen.**

# First Reading Jeremiah 31:31-34

<sup>31</sup>The days are surely coming, says the Lord, when I will make a new covenant with the house of Israel and the house of Judah. <sup>32</sup>It will not be like the covenant that I made with their ancestors when I took them by the hand to bring them out of the land of Egypt—a covenant that they broke, though I was their husband, says the Lord. <sup>33</sup>But this is the covenant that I will make with the house of Israel after those days, says the Lord: I will put my law within them, and I will write it on their hearts; and I will be their God, and they shall be my people. <sup>34</sup>No longer shall they teach one another, or say to each other, "Know the Lord," for they shall all know me, from the least of them to the greatest, says the Lord; for I will forgive their iniquity, and remember their sin no more.

Second Reading Romans 3:19-28

<sup>19</sup>Now we know that whatever the law says, it speaks to those who are under the law, so that every mouth may be silenced, and the whole world may be held accountable to God. <sup>20</sup>For "no human being will be justified in his sight" by deeds prescribed by the law, for through the law comes the knowledge of sin.

<sup>21</sup>But now, apart from law, the righteousness of God has been disclosed, and is attested by the law and the prophets, <sup>22</sup>the righteousness of God through faith in Jesus Christ for all who believe. For there is no distinction, <sup>23</sup>since all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God; <sup>24</sup>they are now justified by his grace as a gift, through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus, <sup>25</sup>whom God put forward as a sacrifice of atonement by his blood, effective through faith. He did this to show his righteousness, because in his divine forbearance he had passed over the sins previously committed; <sup>26</sup>it was to prove at the present time that he himself is righteous and that he justifies the one who has faith in Jesus.

<sup>27</sup>Then what becomes of boasting? It is excluded. By what law? By that of works? No, but by the law of faith. <sup>28</sup>For we hold that a person is justified by faith apart from works prescribed by the law.

<sup>31</sup>Jesus said to the Jews who had believed in him, "If you continue in my word, you are truly my disciples; <sup>32</sup>and you will know the truth, and the truth will make you free." <sup>33</sup>They answered him, "We are descendants of Abraham and have never been slaves to anyone. What do you mean by saying, 'You will be made free'?"

<sup>34</sup>Jesus answered them, "Very truly, I tell you, everyone who commits sin is a slave to sin. <sup>35</sup>The slave does not have a permanent place in the household; the son has a place there forever. <sup>36</sup>So if the Son makes you free, you will be free indeed."

## **Affirmation of Baptism (Rite of Confirmation)**

Merciful God, we thank you for these young people whom you have made your own by water and the Word in Holy Baptism. You have called them to yourself, enlightened them with the gifts of your Spirit, and have nourished them in this community of faith. Uphold them in the promises and responsibilities of Baptism, and unite the hearts of all whom you have brought to new birth. We ask this in the Name of Christ. **Amen.** 

The Pastor addresses those making affirmation:

I ask you to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, to reject sin, and to confess the faith of the Church, the faith in which we baptize.

Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God? (I renounce them.)

Do you renounce the powers of this world that rebel against God? (I renounce them.)

Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you away from God? (I renounce them.)

The Pastor addresses the confirmands and the assembled congregation:

Do you believe in God the Father?

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Do you believe in God the Son?

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead.

Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

You have made public profession of your faith. Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism: to live among and regularly gather with God's faithful people, to hear the Word of God and share in the Lord's Supper, to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through your own word and deed, to serve all people, following the example of Jesus, and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth? (I do, and I ask God to help and guide me.)

People of God, do you promise to surround, support, and pray for these confirmands in their life in Christ? **We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.** 

May God strengthen, bless, and equip us to fully live out these promises we have made this day. **Amen.** 

Those making affirmation kneel for the blessing:

Father in heaven, for Jesus' sake, stir up in \_\_\_\_\_\_ the gift of your Holy Spirit; confirm her/his faith, guide her/his *life*, empower her/him in her/his serving, give her/him patience in suffering, and bring her/him to everlasting life. (Amen.)

The confirmands are presented to the assembly.

## It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Holy God, Mighty Lord, Gracious Father: Endless is your mercy and eternal your reign. You have filled all creation with light and life; heaven and earth are full of your glory. Through Abraham and Sarah you promised to bless all nations. You rescued Israel, your chosen people. Through the prophets you renewed your promise; and, at this end of all the ages, you sent your Son, who, in words and deeds, proclaimed your kingdom and was obedient to your will, even to giving his life.

For in the night in which he was betrayed, our Lord Jesus took bread, and gave thanks; broke it, and gave it to his disciples, saying: Take and eat; this is my body, given for you. Do this for the remembrance of me.

Again, after supper, he took the cup, gave thanks, and gave it for all to drink, saying:
This cup is the new covenant in my blood, shed for you and for all people for the forgiveness of sin.
Do this, as often as you drink of it, for the remembrance of me.

Through him, with him, in him, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, all honor and glory is yours, Almighty Father, now and forever. **Amen.**

Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us. And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil.
